

Some of the Northern papers are speculating as to future movements. One of them professes to have information that the great bulk of the Confederate forces will soon be massed in the West, and when the season for low water in the Cumberland and the Tennessee shall arrive, a bold push will be made, with three objects; 1, to capture the garrison at Chattanooga and recover East Tennessee; 2, to reach the Ohio river and establish control over a section of country from which ample supplies may be drawn; and 3, to again close the Mississippi river and restore communication with the country beyond. It is further predicted that Gens. Lee and Johnston will exchange places, and that the former, for the third time, will essay the offensive. He believes, it is said, in that plan of conducting the war, while Johnston's idea is the defensive policy, which will be put in practice in Virginia. Richmond has been strongly fortified, and President Davis and Gen. Bragg believe that a comparatively small force will be able to make a long stand against the army of Grant, who, it is supposed, will meet with no serious opposition until he shall reach the fortifications of the Confederate capital.

On Thursday last Mr. Mayo, a member of the Ohio Legislature, in a debate in that body, said: "I would rather see this Government destroyed than that one single press should be deprived of the liberty of publishing what its editors pleased." Mr. Free, a Republican member, said that Mr. Mayo's language was an abuse of the liberty of the press, and none but traitors speak or endorse such sentiments, when Mr. Mayor replied with some insulting epithets, and a fight ensued. The Cincinnati Gazette says: The Ohio Democratic Convention resolved against prosecuting the war, and appointed delegates in favor of McClellan.
