

Private Thomas Abrahams, Company G, 130th New York Volunteers, who was on guard over Private Wm. J. Boyle, confined for murder at Williamsburg, Va., and who permitted the said Boyle to escape to the Confederate States, with the information of Gen. Butler's movement towards Richmond, (communicated by Abrahams to Boyle,) has been tried, convicted, and sentenced to be shot to death with musketry at Yorktown, Virginia, and President Lincoln has confirmed the sentence.

Idaho has become the most popular gold mining region of the present time, and the hurrying of miners thither from California and Oregon promises not only to attract attention, but to produce results of an important character. Measures have been taken to suppress crime in Idaho. One county, through its grand jury, had recently found twelve indictments for murder, sixteen for assaults with intent to kill, and one for manslaughter. A thousand men have become a vigilance committee in Beaver Head county.

The Wheeling Intelligencer announces another railroad accident about four miles from Barnesville on the Central Ohio Railroad through a defective rail, one passenger car was thrown down into Leatherwood Creek, and another thrown up into the air. Several men were killed, and many were wounded. A drummer boy was missed, and Mr. Henry Mills of this city was drowned.

A Republican paper, to be called the New Era, is about to be established in Washington. It is to be edited by Mr. Weston, who opposes the re-nomination of Mr. Lincoln.

The brig Lydia Staver, Captain Whitney, from Belfast for Alexandria, with a cargo of bricks and hay, went ashore at the first cliff, at Situate. The crew were saved. The vessel is full of water, and her keel is gone.
