Calvin Pepper was admitted to practice in the Court.

A grand jury was empaneled as follows:—Wm. Arnold, Foreman; John Slater, J. H. Baggott, C. N. Gregory, O. F. Wilkins, H. S. Martin, W. R. Howard, Jos. Broders, G. D. Jeliff, Thos. Dwyer, E. Francis, D. R. Wilson, E. Burchell, W. C. Richards, E. S. Boynton, and C. R. Grimes.

The grand jury presented an indictment against Samuel Colvin, a free negro, for rape—a true bill.

Charles Brill was fined \$50 and ordered to be imprisoned for ten days, and until the fine is paid, for refusing to qualify as a grand juror, by taking the oaths required.

A Washington dispatch to the New York Evening Post, dated yesterday morning says:—"It is believed that a six weeks' campaign will be required for the capture of Richmond. Gen. Grant is reported to have said that he will take Richmond by the 4th of July.—Some of the three months' troops are here, and more are arriving hourly. Three thousand wounded soldiers have left Washington for the Baltimore and Philadelphia Hospitals. All the men wounded in the recent battles will be sent North and the Washington hospitals will be left for future use.

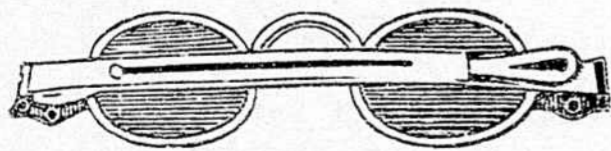
The Washington Star of yesterday evening says that Gen. Up to Saturday morning Gen. Butler had made no demonstration against the fort."
