

MR. STANTON'S DISPATCH.

MAY. 28 1864—9 50 P. M.—Major General Dix, New York: An official di-patch from the headquarters of the army of the Potomac at Nagahick Church, ten mile-from Hanovertown, dated yesterday afternoon, five P. M., has just been received. It states that our army was withdrawn to the north side of the North Anna Thursday night, and moved towards Hanover town, the place designated for crossing the Pamunkey. At nine o'clock yesterday (Friday) morning Sheridan, with the 1st and 2d divisions of cavalry, took possession of Hanover ferry and Hanovertown, finding there only a rebel vidette. The 1st division of the 6th corps arrived at ten A. M., and now holds the place, with sufficient force of cavalry, infantry, and artillery to resist any attack likely to be made upon him. The remainder of the corps is pressing forward with rapidly. Weather fine and roads perfect.

A later dispatch, dated at seven o'clock this morning, the 28th, from headquarters, Nagahick Church, has also been received. It reports that everything goes on finely; weather clear and cool. The troops come up rapidly, and in great spirits, and that the army will be beyond the Pamunkey by noon. Breckinridge is at Hanver Court House, with a force variously reported from three thousand to ten thousand. Wickham's and Lowry's brigades of cavalry are also there. The dispatch further states that, after seizing Hanover's Ferry yesterday, General Torbert captured seventy-five cavalry, including six officers. That the rebel cavalry is exceedingly demoralized, and flees before ours on every occasion.

A dispatch from Gen Sherman, May 28, 6 A. M., near Dallas, reports that the enemy, discovering his move to turn Abooma, moved to meet our forces at Dallas. Our forces met the enemy a out one mile east of the Pamunkey Creek, and we pushed them back about three miles to the point where the roads fork to Atlanta and Marietta. Here Johnson has chosen a strong line, and made hasty but strong parapets of timber and earth. General Sherman's right is at Dallas, the centre about three miles north. The country is densely wooded and broken; no roads of any consequence. We have had many sharp encounters, but nothing decisive.

No di-patches from any other field of operations have been received to-day.
