

S. F. Beach has recently purchased of Wm. Bayne, of Baltimore, the three story brick dwelling and lot, at the southeast corner of Prince and Washington streets, at present occupied by W. D. Massey, for \$8,000. Mrs. Virginia Scott has sold the three story brick dwelling, on Prince street, north side, near the corner of St. Asaph, to Wm. Arnold for \$7,000.

Col. Welford, U. S. army, has returned to Kentucky on parole, with instructions to hold himself in readiness for trial by court martial. Thirteen charges for "disloyal" language are preferred against him by order of President Lincoln. Such is the tenor of a dispatch from Cincinnati.

The trains between Baltimore and Philadelphia have resumed their trips. A foot bridge over Gunpowder river has been built and passengers walk over to the trains. The former bridge was very much damaged, and a locomotive fell through the piles.

The associated banks in New York agree to take \$50,000,000 of the new U. S. loan. They will pay in greenbacks, and not require the State banks to make deposits in Government money.

It is reported, on what authority, we do not know, that the collection of state taxes here, has been suspended for the present. If this is so, it ought to be known; if not so, the report should be contradicted.

The New York Commercial Advertiser shows that prices have advanced more in the last three years, in the U. S. than they did in Great Britain during over twenty years of the long period of wars ending in 1815.

Major Messervey's command of the Wisconsin Battery, at Fort Rogers, in this place, were ordered, during the late operations before Washington, to the defence of that city. They have since returned.

- VI. Captain William M. Gwynne, A. A. D. C. will have charge of the Military Court.—His decision (with the testimony taken) will be received and approved, changed, or disapproved at these Headquarters. He will also issue Liquor Permits.
