

**BIGAMY.**—Michel Owens was arrested in Alexandria, on Friday, taken to Washington, and committed to jail for the crime of bigamy. He married in Ireland in 1857, came to the United States shortly after, and upon the birth of his first child deserted his wife. He enlisted in the Federal army, and for five years past his wife has heard nothing of him. She resides in Portland, Maine. Hearing recently that he had married a second time and was living with his new wife in Alexandria, she came hither, and entered proceedings to break up the arrangement. Annie McNamara, his second wife, was not aware that he had ever been married. She became the mother of a child by him on Monday last. His term of service as a soldier expired some time since; but a comrade of his, who had been in the service with him, who knew of his first marriage, and witnessed the second, excused himself for his participation in the crime by saying that he regarded the enlistment in the service of the United States as equivalent to a divorce from the marriage bond.

The execution of two soldiers in the Army of the Potomac, convicted of rape, took place last Wednesday. While the culprits were suspended, General Patrick addressed the spectators. He stated that it was the intention of Generals Grant and Meade, and of every good and true man in the army, "that this violation of the sacred rights of home should be stopped. He called attention to the existing raid in the North, and asked those present who had a mother, or a sister, or a wife, or even a friend, to picture to themselves their misery, if the ravages of war had invaded the sanctuary of their dear homes."

Major H. R. Thomas, an additional paymaster in the United States army, has been tried by a court martial held in Washington, upon the charge of defrauding the government, and sentenced to "forfeit all pay and allowance now due or to become due him, to be confined in the State Penitentiary at Albany New York, for six years, and to pay the Government of the U. S. \$35,000."
