

It would seem, by a letter from Havana in the New York Herald, that the Spanish (Home) Press rebuked the demand of the Spanish Cuban Government upon Secretary Seward, for Arguelles, and the surrender of him as sharply as the New York Democratic Press.

Since the late robbery of Wells, Fargo & Co.'s Express, on the Washoe route, when \$21,000 were taken, several other robberies of a like character have taken place at other points in the State of California. A large portion of the treasure first stolen, which was heavy silver bullion, has been found where the highwaymen buried it.

Since the invasion of Baltimore county by Gilmer's cavalry, numerous reports have received publicity as to their having been entertained by citizens along the line of their march. These reports, however, have very generally been proved unfounded.

Gen. Jim Lane, of Kansas, is still full of fight. In a speech made in St. Louis, a few days ago, he said: "I am in favor not only of this war, but of the next war and all other wars. [Immense cheering] War has become and American institution."

On Thursday last Messrs. Bushong & Sons, of Reading, Pa., closed a negotiation for the sale of 3,000 barrels of whisky, being all their stock in store there, to a firm in Philadelphia, at \$1.70 per gallon. The transaction foots up the handsome sum of over \$250,000.

Wm. Begg, nephew of the poet Burns, departed this life at the residence of Dr. Cole, Clinton, Canada, on Saturday last. Mr. Begg, who was 68 or 69 years of age at the time of his decease, was the son of Burns's sister Isabella, well known to every reader of the poet's biographies.

The Chicago Tribune reports serious damage to the wheat crop in Illinois by the ravages of the chinch bug. Thousands of acres of wheat have been destroyed.

The Springfield (Mass.) Union says: "The drought interferes with the railroad men quite as much as it does with the farmers. The wells give out, and the station water-tanks, on which the locomotives depend for a supply of water, are filled with difficulty."

A cargo of rum entered at the Boston Custom house some days ago valued at \$4,853, paid a duty of \$4,898.50 in gold.
