

A letter from Washington, in the Baltimore Sun says that the damage done to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, in the late raid, taking the work in its whole length is very serious.—The Antietam aqueduct, twelve miles west of the Ferry is practically "gone up." Much damage was done, and all the locks of the canal between Antietam and Williamsport, also comprising that region of the canal from which comes the chief flour, grain, and produce trade. Lock No. 40 is entirely destroyed, while the gates of the others are generally injured so as to be rendered useless at present. Beyond Williamsport to Cumberland the damage is but slight. This eastern end of the line has not yet been sufficiently well explored to determine the nature of the injuries, but they are thought to be more in the form of obstructions, by the sinking of coal boats, &c., than otherwise.

Five steamers have recently arrived at Bermuda from Wilmington, with an aggregate of three thousand bales of cotton and a large quantity of tobacco. Three steamers cleared on the 7th from Wilmington. The steamer Little Hattie had returned in distress, from being chased by a Federal gunboat.

Gen. McDowell, at San Francisco, has issued an order requiring passengers of ocean steamers to give up their arms and permit the examination of their baggage. The object is to prevent the probable danger of attempts to take possession of steamers on that coast by passengers.

Nixon's Mills, an extensive paper manufactory at Manayunk, Pennsylvania, was destroyed by fire last night. The loss is estimated at from \$100,000 to \$120,000.
