BUFFALO, July 26.—The following dispatch has been received here from the Clifton House:

Two of Dupont's Powder Mills, about four miles from Wilmington, Delaware, were blown to atoms, on Saturday evening. A number of persons were injured by the explosion.

Advices from Mexico state that Gen. Ford, in command of the Confederates has demanded the surrender of Brownsville. Gen. Herron is in command of the Federal forces at that place.

Dispatches from Louisville states that a Confederate force, number not known, was threatening Bradenburg, with the supposed intention of crossing into Indiana.

Another large fire has occurred at Georgetown, Demarara. The value of property destroyed is estimated at a quarter of a million of dollars.

Business is dull in Georgetown. No supply of coal. The repairs, on the canal are going on, as expeditiously as possible.

Advices from Missouri state that forty miles of railroad, west of Hanibal, are in the possession of the Confederates.
