

Earl Russell, in a recent speech in the House of Commons, stated that one of the reasons why he did not favor the armed intervention of England in the Danish German question was the great power of the United States, and the danger to their commerce. He says:

"There are other parts of the world in which our interests may be as deeply involved, and in which we may have, some day or other, to maintain the honor and interests of this country. The civil war now raging in America, ending how it may, whether by the establishment of an independent republic in the South, or whether it ends most unexpectedly as it would be to me, I confess, by restoring the Union, still the United States of America, or the Northern States, or whatever they may be called, will then be a totally different position to that which they were in a few years ago.— A great army will then be maintained by the United States. A formidable navy will also be kept up. Our relations with that Power are liable at any moment to interruption. I hope and trust that our friendly relations may be maintained; still those friendly relations must be considered and kept in view as well as our interest in the maintenance of the balance of power in Europe."

The English journals are absorbed with the great debate in Parliament, on the proposition to "censure" the Palmerston Ministry, for its non-intervention on behalf of Denmark. The Times naturally rejoices in the result which, with all its ardent support of the Government, it was not sanguine enough to predict. It remarks that:—"A question vastly more simple than the general character of the debate would seem to imply, has been settled by a division happily more decisive than we had been led to expect. In a very full House, a majority of eighteen—just twice as large as the majority the other way in the Lords—has vindicated the intentions and indemnified the failures of her Majesty's Government."
