GENERAL NEWS.

A Washington dispatch says:—"Government has given up the experiment of supporting the blacks at Freedmen's Village, Arlington. Work is offered to all willing to labor, at the usual prices, and rent is charged them for their tenements at \$4 per month. All incapable or unwilling to accept these terms are to be removed to Mason's Island, near Georgetown. There are numerous applications from the North for their services, but it is almost impossible to induce any of them to migrate in that direction."

On Sunday, Wm. B. Donaldson, well known in Washington, was arrested and taken to the Old Capitol prison. Donaldson was formerly a circus clown, it is said—cause of arrest not known certainly.

The two Garretts (at whose house, near Port Royal, in Virginia, Booth and Herrold were found) were taken in charge of a marine guard from the Navy Yard to the Old Capitol on Saturday afternoon. One of them is the young man who informed Lieut. Baker that the parties he wanted were in the barn. It is supposed they are held as witnesses.

J. H. Blackburn, alias Dr. Tumblety, charged with complicity with Herrold in the assassination conspiracy, has been arrested in St. Louis in accordance with orders from Washington.

It is stated that General Halleck has been instructed to rescind that part of his recent order which forbids matrimony until the contracting parties have taken the oath of allegiance.

A State convention has been called to assemble at Vicksburg on the first Monday of June, to adopt measures to restore the State of Mississippi to the Union, and re-establish a State government. A similar convention is proposed in South Carolina, to meet at Charleston.

The trial of Mrs. Perine (daughter of the late Judge Z. Collins Lee), of Baltimore, commenced at Washington, yesterday, before a Military Commission, of which General G. H. Chapman is President and Col. Spencer is Judge Advocate.

The Government has possession in Washington and vicinity of a number of private buildings that are at present used for hospitals and other purposes. A thorough cleaning out of these buildings is about to be made, and they will then be turned over to their former owners. The Government hospitals will also be abandoned as fast as circumstances will permit.

Upon the news of the surrender of Johnston's army, Gen. Sheridan, who was with his command at Abbeville on his way to Danville, was ordered to return to Petersburg. General Wright, with the sixth corps, is to remain at Danville.

The Richmond and Lynchburg road is rapidly being placed in running order, and it is expected will be in readiness for use in the course of a week. The Southside road, which was made narrower to fit the gauge of other cars, is to be placed back to the old gauge.
