**NEWS BY TO-DAY'S MAIL**

An accident occurred to "the President's car" on the train from Gettysburg on the evening of the Fourth. Several of the party in the car were injured. Senor Buruaga, the Chilian Minister, and C. G. Halpine, the poet of the celebration, were severely cut about the head, and others were slightly injured.

A breach has take place between Maximilian and the Pope. Diplematic relations are suspended, and it is expected that the Papal Nuncio will shortly leave Mexico. An Austrian paper says that Maximilian's palace at Miramon has been furnished and put in order for his expected return.

It is reported that the Government intends to sieze the gold mines in North Carolina. These mines have heretofore produced more gold than the Territory of Nevada now does. Gov. Holden is overrun with applications for pardons. The Governor has appointed J. T. Hough, Mayor of Newbern.

The safe of a Mississippi steamboat, on her way to New Orleans, the Alhambra, was riddled at \$40,000, on the 1st instant. The passengers were searched, and the money recovered, with the exception of \$17,000, which was thrown overboard. Two men, on whom suspicion rested, were taken into custody.

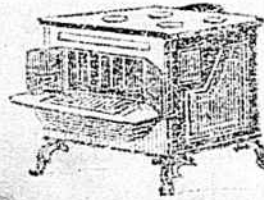
The proposed tariff of charges on the new Atlantic cable is, to England, twenty words or less, \$100 in gold; each extra word, \$5. To the continent, twenty words, \$105; extra words, \$5 25 each. To Asia or Africa, twenty words, \$125! each extra word, \$6 25.

It is stated that Charles Jas. Faulkner has not been pardoned by the President. He has the subject under consideration.

Nearly forty-three thousand prisoners have been discharged by the War Department since the close of the war.

The corner stone of the monument at Gettysburg was laid with imposing ceremonies, on the 4th instant, and the procession formed at nine o'clock, preceded by Generals Meade, Geary, Howard, Sykes, Mott, and other officers. The Baltimore Musical Association sang an ode, and a letter from President Johnson, regretting his inability to attend, was read. The Masonic ceremonies were most impressive. Gen. Howard delivered an oration, which excited much cheering. Col. Halpine read a "Miles O'Reilly" poem, which was well received.

The Blak Republican is a newspaper in New Orleans edited by a colored man (a clergyman,) who, it would seem from the following does not think that the regeneration of his brethren is to be accomplished by voting and tax paying: "The colored man and the white man cannot live together in this country; they must, and will have to separate, unless the Congress of the nation will give them a place for themselves, for as it was with Abraham and Lot, so it is with us, and the sooner we seek a home for our rising generation, the better it will be for us. Our final destiny, so far as I can dimly see, is that in three hundred years it will be a rare thing to see a colored man in this country."
