ALLEN AUDITOR.

Deadlock Dead, Massey Defeated, and S. Brown Allen Elected Auditor of Public Accounts.

In the Senate a Motion to Adjourn and Break the Joint Order Defeated. Mr. Hale voting with 'The Big Four' and Mr. Wingfield of Hanover with the Redjusters—Massey Gets Four Votes in the Senate and Two in the House—The Democrat Vote for Their Nominees and the Redjusters for Theirs—Senator George A. Martin Elected Railroad Commissioner, but Will Not Go In for a Year—Personal Explanations—Notes of Legislation.

In the Senate yesterday the bill to incorporate the Norfolk and Danville Railroad Company came up as unfinished business. Mr. Rue moved to reconsider the agreement, in order to put on an amendment.

Mr. Thurman opposed the motion, as likely to delay and kill the bill at this late day of the session. Mr. Walker took the same ground, and Mr. Rue withdrew his motion and the bill was passed.

WATER-WORKS DAM. Mr. Diggs moved a suspension of the rules to take up the bill to authorize the Richmond and Albemarle Railroad Company to extend its line at Lynchburg and to condemn such lands as may be necessary. Agreed to.
