

READY FOR THE VEIL. THE R. E. LEE STATUE NOW ON THE PEDESTAL. Work Preparatory to the Ceremonies of the 20th Nearly Completed—Large Delegations From the North as Well as the South Expected.

THE WHITE VEIL. As soon as Mr. Cole finishes with the statue a white veil will be put around it. Late Saturday night or early morning it will be pulled up and the statue will be unveiled. The men employed on the statue will also be in attendance on the 20th, so that if from any possible cause they should be unable to appear, they will be present on the 21st.

THE CEREMONIES. The ceremonies of the unveiling have not been decided on fully as yet. This will be done by the Lee society. It has been decided that the statue on the pedestal, when taken down, will be used for seats. The grand and speakers' stands will be placed on the east and south side of the pedestal.
