God which Moses offered in behalf of Israel's army. There was a co-operation between Aaron and Hur with Moses in his prayer. As they held up Moses' hands they united with him in this outward expression of prayer. God heard and answered. "If two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father, which is in heaven."

Co-operation with God, 1 Cor. 3:9-11: "Laborers together with God." It is wonderful to have God as our partner. The farmer plants the seed, God sends the sunshine and then comes the harvest. In our business or in mental labors God is just as really our partner, when we let Him help us. This is also true indeed of our special work which God gives us in connection with building up His kingdom in the world.

A United Church, Acts 4:32-37: The one purpose and spirit which animates the true Church of God is the desire to do God's will and perform the duties which He assigns. There may be differences in name, in organization and in some unessential doctrines, but there should be the unity of the Spirit.

Power of Unity, Acts 5:12-16: Oneness of aim, purpose and effort produced a good impression upon the people, and enabled the Church to do the work that God had given it to do. Where there is lack of unity, there will be lack of harmony, and in many cases there will be animosity. In unity there is strength.

Flying Squadrons, Mk. 6:7-13: Jesus sent out his disciples in pairs, and oftentimes it is well for us to work in the same way. We will be an inspiration to one another and our united effort will have more effect upon others than individual effort.

Doing Their Bit, Ex. 35:4, 5, 30-35: When God told Moses to build the tabernacle He told him to call upon the people for offerings. He wanted something from each of them, but each one was to give what he had. Some gave money, some material of various kinds, some labor according to what kind they were skilled in. By this united effort the tabernacle was built. We can build God's kingdom in the same way.

Co-operation in Christian Service, John 17:20-23; 1 Cor. 3:5-10: Our Saviour prays for the unity of his people, for this will be a strong proof to the world that there is a reality in the religion which they profess. One of the things that long hindered the growth of God's kingdom was the differences among His people. Those differences are disappearing and God's work is being accomplished as never before. There must also be co-operation in labor. When men are "laborers together with God," there will not be any failure to work harmoniously together, and so great results will be accomplished.

What Are the Advantages of Christian Unity? We present a strong front to the world and to the devil. By united effort we can do more than we can by individual effort. An army is powerful in proportion to the way in which its units co-operate with each other in striving for a common object.

Why Should God's People Be One? Because they have one Father, one Saviour, one Spirit, one hope, one work.

How Can Endeavorers Co-operate in Christian Work? By cultivating Christian unity of spirit, by working together, by working with the other parts of the church, by uniting to help the pastor and others engaged in Christian work.

TENNESSEE DOING THINGS.

For the first time in four years Tennessee held her State Convention separate from some other convention. Convention was held in Nashville, in Vine Street Christian church, and brought delegates from almost every point in State.

President Warren Newsum presided over the sessions, and with his pleasing personality and cheery smile greatly increased the enthusiasm of the delegates. Southern States Secretary Lehmann gave the convention a great start in the opening sessions Friday afternoon and evening, with his ever-contagious enthusiasm and pep. Mr. A. La Verne Spafford, Field Secretary of Michigan, won the hearts of the convention Endeavorers with his splendid spirit of consecration and good fellowship, and the intense messages he brought to the convention. Mr. Spafford spent the month of October in Tennessee and reports the outlook for the coming year as being a very bright one. Tennessee Endeavorers were loud in their praise of Mr. Spafford's work, and he will find a royal welcome awaiting him should he return for other trips.

Mr. B. H. Hunnicutt, Christian Endeavor Missionary in Brazil, supported by the Endeavorers of the Southern Presbyterian Church, gave a stirring message of the work in Brazil and of the great opportunities there. Mr. Hunnicutt has been in Brazil for twelve years, is now home on furlough, but will soon return to his field, and says he shall not leave it until he has trained some one to take the work.

Pastors and laymen of the State added greatly to the program by the splendid work they did in the convention.

The social time Friday evening was a delight to every one, and proved the ability of the Nashville Endeavorers to provide an evening of enjoyment which took care of the whole crowd.

Reports showed progress along several lines, but especially encouraging was the report of the Quiet Hour superintendent, Miss Nell Pence, Bristol, showing the State had reached and passed its goal for comrades of the Quiet Hour.

The Appalachian District, which includes Bristol and the eastern part of the State, has done an exceptional aggressive work during the past year. This district gave more to the State work during the past year than it was asked to give, and still had money left in the treasury, all of which was largely due to the untiring work of James A. Brown, the District Treasurer, who was this year elected as State Treasurer. The delegates from this district had to start the day before the convention opened in order to arrive on time.

Sufficient subscriptions were received and pledged to put the State "over the top" on its goal for the Dixie Endeavorer.

In proportion to the number of societies represented in the convention, the finances pledged and given for the coming year were considerably beyond expectations, and if other societies in the State make their gifts accordingly this will be the very largest and best year the State has ever known.

Action was taken by the Executive Committee looking forward to regular field work after the New Orleans convention next year.
