WORK OF THE CITY FATHERS WHO LIVE ACROSS THE RIVER.

To Establish a Chain-Gang—More Fire Apparatus—To License Plumbers—Inspect Premises.

MANCHESTER BUREAU RICHMOND TIMES: 1121 HULL STREET, BEAVER BLOCK. The city council held its regular session in the council chamber last evening, when the following members were present: Messrs. O'Brien (chairman), Morton, Fahr, Hart, Taylor, Weisger, Ely, Sims, Morris, Uiz, Starke and Campbell.

The report of the chief of police for the past month was read and filed. It states that during that period the following arrests have been made: felony, 1; misdemeanor, 50; violations of ordinances, 37. The sum of \$6 was collected for fines.

The finance committee presented a report through Mr. Weisger, recommending the payment of bills amounting to \$1,661.78. A large part of this sum is to be expended for the relief of the poor, covering a period of two months.

Another report of the same committee referred to the disposal of city bonds. Both reports were adopted. An ordinance providing for the establishment of a chain-gang in this city was read and referred to the ordinance committee.

The fire committee recommended that one red and 99 feet of hose be placed at Mr. J. P. Robinson's house, on Fifteenth and Hill streets.

The city attorney also requested to prepare an ordinance to protect the fire hose at fires. The report of the committee was adopted.
