A called meeting of the board of directors of the Chamber of Commerce and of the special committee to aid the State Board of Health was held yesterday evening.

Judge Christian announced the standing committees for the ensuing year, after which the Chair stated that the principal object of the meeting was to hear from the State Board of Health and other physicians as to the importance of promptly inaugurating the work of the board.

Dr. Landon B. Edwards then addressed the meeting, saying that he desired to emphasize the necessity of organization; that this board had been appointed at the instance of the Chamber; but to be of any value must have the financial aid of the public; that the doctors had not counted the position in which they found themselves as custodians of the public health, and that reality of the matter is the concern of the doctors as of the public.
