

NOT A FAIR SHOWING.

RICHMOND IS ONE OF THE MOST HEALTHFUL CITIES.

Instead of Being One of the Most Unhealthy, as Appears from the Published Death Rates.—The Committee.

The Council Committee on Health held a meeting yesterday evening, and again the question of the health of the city of Richmond was discussed, and alleged high death rate.

Dr. H. H. Levy, E. H. Bissell and Thomas L. A. Friend, of the Committee on Health and Sanitation of the Chamber of Commerce, were in attendance.

The following members of the Council Committee were present: Messrs. Reeve (chairman), George B. Davis, Grimes, King and Moore, President Dickinson, of the Board of Aldermen, President Glover of the Common Council, Dr. W. T. O'Connell, president of the Board of Health, presided over the chair.

The minutes and the transaction of some regular business, Chairman Reeve stated that he recognized the presence of the gentleman from the Chamber of Commerce, and deemed it proper they should not be heard from on this question so much importance.

Mr. A. Friend, chairman of the committee from the Chamber of Commerce, on the subject, he read a report adopted on the subject of the Chamber of Commerce, recommending that the services of two experts be secured for the purpose of looking into the sanitary condition of the city.

Dr. Levy referred to the recommendation from the President of the Board of Health a year ago, teaching on sanitary improvements for the city, which were not carried out by the government of the city at that time nor since.

In this connection the chairman said: "I have used my best efforts in the limited time at my disposal to get at the bottom facts bearing on this question, and I submit it to the press to show the figures and if correct to turn their batteries on those who from carelessness or other cause have placed us in such a false light before the world."

Dr. Levy presented a table of the average life of eight cities, taken from the Government reports. The table shows Richmond at the bottom, with an average life of 33.2 years, while New York is at the top with an average life of 43.3 years.
