

DEATH AND RUIN.

Storms Played Havoc in the South.

SCORES OF PERSONS KILLED.

Charleston and Savannah Victims of the Cyclone.

THE FORMER ALMOST SUBMERGED.

Many Houses Demolished and Streets Filled With Water.

SULLIVAN'S ISLAND UNDER WATER.

Almost Incalculable Damage to Shipping Interests.

MANY SHIPS GO DOWN AT SEA.

A Great Many Seamen Washed Overboard and Drowned.

GREAT DAMAGE TO CROWING CROPS.

Tobacco in Virginia and North Carolina and Cotton in South Carolina and Georgia Damaged to an Alarming Extent.

Fateful Charleston was subjected to the full fury of the Bermuda tornado Sunday night and not until to day was it possible for the outside world to gain tidings of the terrible havoc wrought there by the wind and water.

The damage done to churches will amount to over \$50,000. These materials damaged are as follows: Mount Zion, A. M. E. church; roof crushed in and walls cut in; loss \$35,000.

Another Account of the Storm. Sunday's storm injured many buildings in Savannah and did great damage to the trees. Only four buildings sustained serious damage.

The greatest wreck is at Peggall's dock yard where the loss is \$30,000. Hundreds of small crafts in the harbor were carried off by the storm and every shed is down.

Reports of the storm from various towns in South Carolina, show considerable damage to buildings, trees, crops, etc.

WRECK AND RUIN WROUGHT.

Great Loss of Life and Property in and Around Savannah.

SAVANNAH, GA., August 29.—The list of fatalities is gradually growing and it is impossible to tell to what extent it will go.

The drowning of Mr. A. G. Ulmer, Assistant Cashier of the Central Railroad Bank, was one of the most unfortunate fatalities of the storm.

The wrecking of the steamship City of Savannah, which was wrecked on Tybee Island, is about the worst disaster of the storm.
