NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—Prices of stocks fractionally quite a wide range during the day throughout the list, but net changes here almost all fractional, and the majority on the side of losses.

There was a continuation of the heavy absorption of Southern Pacific, which gave a healthy tone to the railroad list.

As hearing on the money situation, it is important to note that advances from the money market in the immediate future are expected to be moderate.

Prices for bonds moved irregularly in sympathy with stocks.
