WILL ENTER A FORMAL PROTEST

Traction People Guard Broad St. Tracks.

NOTICE OF ATTORNEYS

Messrs. Meredith and Williams Before Sub-Committee.

BUT TROUBLE MAY BE AVOIDED.

Sub Committee Adopts Amendments as to Use of Broad Street Tracks by the Proposed New Company Which Were Prepared Jointly by Attorneys of the Rival Companies.

The Richmond Traction Company will formally protest, in writing, against the use of its Broad street tracks by the Richmond Passenger and Power Company, which it seems certain will acquire the property of the other company and operate under the terms of an ordinance now in process of preparation. Attorneys for the company announced to the sub-committee on streets last night the determination to protest against a provision in the new ordinance which permits the new company to run a portion of the Broad street tracks of the Traction Company. Later, however, the sub-committee incorporated in the ordinance amendments recognizing the existence of a prior contract between the city and the Traction Company, and it therefore should be retained, no action may be taken in furtherance of the objects of the protest.

HOLD LONG SESSION.
The sub-committee on streets which has in charge the matter of preparation of an ordinance defining the rights and powers of the Richmond Passenger and Power Company, to which the franchises of the Richmond Railway and Electric Company will probably be surrendered, held a long session last night. The committee went over a new draft of the proposed ordinance, which was considered carefully.

Those present were Mr. Pollock, chairman; and Messrs. King, Gibson, Burton and Woody, of the sub-committee; City Attorney Pollard, City Engineer Cuthshaw, and representatives of the Richmond Traction Company, Messrs. Meredith and E. Williams, and of the proposed corporation, Messrs. Martin and Abadie.

At the outset there was a spirited contention over the insertion of amendments proposed by Mr. Martin, which had been approved by the attorneys of the Traction Company. The city of the amendments was a recognition in the ordinance under consideration of the prior existence of a contract between the city and the Richmond Traction Company. Both street railway attorneys contended vigorously for the amendments, and several members of the committee opposed them with equal warmth, the dissenting members objecting to the insertion in the proposed ordinance of provisions distinctly set forth in the franchise granted the Traction Company. Finally, however, upon the approval by the committee of the proposed amendments they were adopted.

THE AMENDMENTS.
The first of these amendments, over which the controversy occurred, amends the second section of the ordinance, in the following terms:
"The provisions to use and run over the tracks of the Richmond Traction Company from Ninth and Broad streets to Laurel and Broad streets is given subject to and under each of the following conditions, provided that the terms of the franchise approved on August 1, 1895, entitled 'An ordinance to authorize the construction and operation of a street railway within the limits of the city of Richmond by the Richmond Traction Company.'"

The second amendment subjects the use by the new company of the present tracks of the Richmond Union Passenger Railway Company from Twenty-fourth and Broad to Twenty-fifth and Broad streets to the terms of the present agreement with the Richmond Traction Company, under an ordinance approved April 1, 1895. The third amendment similarly recognizes the Traction Company's contract with the Richmond Union Passenger Railway Company as to the use of the tracks from Hancock to Harrison on Broad street.

In the rest, the changes and emendations were of no great importance. The committee adjourned at 11:20 o'clock to meet again at 2 o'clock next Monday afternoon.

QUESTION OF TAXATION.
President Bemis, of the Traction Company, and Mr. C. V. Meredith, of counsel for that company, appeared before the Finance Committee and protested against any change being made in the taxation of the Traction Company's property, and Mr. Meredith argued the point, and certain facts and figures were submitted. The company now pays five per cent. of its gross receipts. It has been proposed to change this to make the tax 1.50 on all property and five per cent. of the receipts.

A TALE OF THE SEA.

The Schooner Edna and Emma Found Bottom Up—The Captain's Diary.
PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 15.—Private advices received here to-day from St. Pierre, Miquillon, a seaport on the New Foundland coast, tell of the wreck of the Philadelphia and Baltimore schooner Edna and Emma, and the loss of the captain, his wife and crew of five men.
The Edna and Emma sailed from Wilmington, N. C., on April 14th with a cargo of lumber for Baltimore and this city. Months having elapsed and no word of the vessel's whereabouts having been received, she was given up for lost, recently she was towed into St. Pierre, where it was found that the ship was righted, in the cabin were found the bodies of Captain Richardson and his wife. A water stained diary kept by the captain gave meagre information concerning the disaster. The record stated that the Edna and Emma had experienced a severe weather until May 1st, when a fierce northeast storm overtook her and she was dismasted. Later the rudder became jammed and in this disabled condition the schooner was driven about at the mercy of the wind and waves. One by one the members of the crew were washed overboard, and Captain Richardson and his wife sought refuge in the cabin. At this point the story of the diary ends.

A PASSENGER STEAMER AFIRE

The Patria of the Hamburg-American Line.

PASSENGERS ALL SAFE

They Were Transferred to the Russian Steamer Ceres.

MANY LADIES AND CHILDREN

Aboard and Their Safety Was the First Consideration—The Crew Worked Like Heroes and Displayed as Much Coolness as if at Drill—Escorted in Light Raiment.

LONDON, Nov. 15.—The Hamburg-American steamer Patria, which left New York November 14th for Hamburg, and passed the Lizard yesterday, is on fire near Dover. All the passengers were rescued and have arrived at Dover.

The Russian steamer Ceres sighted the Patria, showing signals of distress and rendering immediate help. About 12 miles from North Foreland the Patria was enveloped in smoke. Putting on full steam the Ceres soon reached the Patria, and sending a boat loaded with assistance, the boats were not out, and with the greatest difficulty all of the Patria's passengers, numbering 150, were transferred to the Ceres, which proceeded for Dover, where she arrived just before midnight.

Francis W. Prescott, the United States Consul in Dover, was immediately notified and he consulted with the local authorities who arranged to send out the harbor tug, Lady Vira, which brought the rescued ashore.

MANY LADIES ABOARD.
Among the saved are many ladies and children, as well as six babies in arms. The hurry of the rescue was indicated by the fact that most of the passengers were undressed in blankets only. They were rapidly distributed among the hotels or sent to the sailors' home, and everything possible is being done for their comfort.

According to interviews with some of the passengers, which elicited the fact that most of them are American citizens who have come for a vacation in Europe, all were ordered on deck at six o'clock on Wednesday morning, when they were informed that a disastrous fire had broken out among the general cargo and, as the crew were unable to master it, the captain had been ordered to abandon ship. The passengers were told to take to the boats. At this time it was evident that the fire had obtained a thorough hold upon the cargo. Smoke and flame were ascending with overpowering force, and causing the greatest alarm. The crew, according to several passengers, had been ordered to their endeavors to keep the flames under, but the great quantity of lashed among the cargo, and the oil supplied by this made all their efforts hopeless.

COOLNESS OF CREW.
There was very great excitement among the women and children, but the example set by the officers of Captain Frohlich and the crew had a calming effect on the passengers generally. The boats were promptly got over the side, the crew working as if there were at drill. The safety of the ladies and children was the first consideration. As the fire had been burning for some time, the greater part of the passengers' belongings, they had to get into the boats as they had some up from their bunks, and some were in very light raiment.

The scene was a striking one, with some touching aspects, as husbands and fathers sought for wives and children. Although everything was carried out under the most trying conditions, thanks to the great coolness of the captain and the crew, there was no panic, all of the passengers being gotten into the boats and into two fishing boats said to belong to Yarmouth, which had come in from the fishing grounds.

CREW PICK UP HELD.
Just as this had been effected a large steamer was seen to be making toward the burning liner. She proved to be the Ceres, which first sent a boat and then picked up all the Patria's passengers.

The Ceres also offered the use of her hospital to the crew, but the latter preferred to remain by the vessel so long as there was any chance of saving her, although there was the greatest danger in doing so, her hull being red-hot at the time and there being every evidence that she would burn for a considerable time.

The passengers say they learned from the officers that Captain Frohlich proposed to put his steamer ashore at some point on the coast, where there will be a possibility of saving her.

TAX ON BANANAS.
Guatemala Government Imposes a Duty of 10 Cents a Stem.

MOBILE, ALA., Nov. 15.—The steaming Managua, from Guatemala ports arrived last night with half a cargo of bananas. She reports that since the Guatemalan government put on their export duty of ten cents a stem on bananas, planters have stopped cutting and the steamer's fruit are not obtainable.

The steamer's fruit came in this morning reporting storms in Spanish Honduras so severe as to wash out bridges on the Honduras railroad and prevent handling of fruit by rail. The steamer therefore brought bananas.

The captain of the Managua says the ten cents tax on bananas is for revenue purposes to defray expenses of the recent anti-revolutionary operations; that ten cents a stem amounts to 25 per cent. of what planters get for bananas, and is about all the profit there is from raising the fruit. The tax was imposed November 1st.

A committee of planters has gone to see the President of Guatemala to try to get the tax removed.

Died in Manila.
WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—A dispatch from Manila announces the death of Captain Magnus O. Harris, Fourth Infantry, who died of dysentery in the hospital, and was appointed West Point from Newnan, Ga.

Grangers in Session.
SPRINGFIELD, OHIO, Nov. 15.—The thirty-third annual session of the National Grange convened in this city with Master Aaron Jones, of South Bend, Ind., in the chair. Twenty-six States are represented.

Boers Looting.
CAPE TOWN, Friday, Nov. 10.—A dispatch from Bulawayo dated Friday, November 10, says an armed train proceeded south close to Mafeking, where a covert was found and looted. A party of Boers, the police, the dispatch adds, reported that a party of Boers have been looting and damaging property.

JUDGE TONEY RESTRAINED

By the Appellate Court From Proceeding in Contempt Cases.

LOUISVILLE, KY., Nov. 15.—Judge Sterling B. Toney, whose mandamus issued on election day for the admission of Honey Election League inspectors to polling places, caused the principal excitement of that day, was today restrained by the Appellate Court at Frankfort, from taking any further action in the contempt cases growing out of the order. Yesterday 35 alleged violators of Judge Toney's order were bound over by him in the sum of \$500 each. To-day he was proceeding with the cases, and had sentenced one prisoner to 30 hours in jail, when the order of the Appellate Court was received.
