

REV. DR. GUTHRIE SAYS FAREWELL. His Touching Address to His Congregation Sunday.

The New Pastor Preaches His First Sermon—Rev. Mr. Louthan Called.

The Second Presbyterian church was filled Sunday by the congregations and a number of persons who belong to other churches, to listen to the farewell sermon of Rev. Dr. Donald Guthrie, who goes to Baltimore, to become pastor of the First Presbyterian church of that city.

Rev. Dr. Guthrie chose as his text, Gal. 6:2 "Bear ye one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ."

"Sympathy or the outward manifestation of the essential of believers," was the first point touched upon by Dr. Guthrie and while he pointed out that it was not becoming to make self dominant as the servant may obscure the Master and the human message of the Gospel, yet one should choose some aspect of truth, not inharmonious with the spirit of the occasion and touch upon personal matters.

"I can succeed only," declared the speaker, "when the whole manhood acts as a unit and the heart and head and hand co-operate."

"The favourer comes by ancient bardic formulae; and all ye blind behold. The dumb shall sing; the lame his crutch forego."

"And so our sympathy should aim at practical results, and while there are certain spheres into which sympathy should not enter, there remains a wide sphere for sympathy and in congregational life the aim of sympathy is the adjustment of outward relationships to the inward with the consent of all believers."

"I would point on the necessity of sympathy in view of the vacancy that is left to pastors than this church, which has been proven by you on many occasions and in tender ways. Personally I bear witness to this fact you have been to me all that any man has a right to be to me."

LOYAL TO ONE ANOTHER. "Now you must be loyal to one another and being so it will not be long before you obtain the man whom the Lord has intended for you."
