A SIGNAL VICTORY.

The Committee on Privileges and Election has done nobly in deciding to recommend the seating of Hon. JOHN MERCER LANGSTON of the Fourth Congressional District of Virginia and Mr. MILLER of the Seventh Congressional District of South Carolina.

Both of the contestants are Colored and this makes three Negro representatives upon the floor of the Halls of Congress.

We have steadily maintained that to fail to seat Mr. LANGSTON would have been especially disastrous to the Republican Party. That he was elected was apparent to any one who chose to examine into the merits of the case.

He was bitterly opposed by white Republicans who declared that no Negro should go to Congress from that District. He was denied representation at the count, only his enemies witnessing the same and thousands of bona-fide Republicans were denied the right to cast their ballots. Mr. LANGSTON proved that instead of Mr. E. C. VENABLE having 642 majority he (VENABLE) had been defeated by over 2,500 majority.

The question which naturally presented itself was whether or not the Republican Party could afford to endorse such outrages.

Mr. LANGSTON as a citizen of Virginia, a resident of the District clearly had the right to aspire for the Congressional nomination. There must be much rejoicing over the successful termination of a case which has lingered until almost the closing hour of the first session.

We presume that the BRECKENRIDGE Case had much to do with the reaching of the above conclusions. Hon. JOHN M. CLAYTON was murderously butchered while endeavoring to secure testimony to make good his title to the seat occupied by Mr. C. E. BRECKENRIDGE. A subcommittee consisting of members of the Committee on Privileges and Elections visited Arkansas and after hearing testimony and seeing the condition of affairs, Chairman LACEY declared that they considered themselves lucky to get out of the confines of the state alive, and had no desire to tempt Providence again.

In the meantime, the subcommittee has decided to recommend that the seat now held by Mr. C. E. BRECKENRIDGE be declared vacant.

It was evidence secured in this manner that served to bring about an immediate termination of the cases referred to. Mr. E. C. VENABLE will now be ousted from a seat to which he had never been elected and Congressman JOHN MERCER LANGSTON will receive the recognition bestowed upon him by the voters of the 4th Congressional District more than a year and a half ago.

Well done, Colored men! Now rally again, organize thoroughly and let the welkin ring with

THE CITY ELECTION.

The city election is over. That Mr. JAMES C. SMITH was robbed of thousands of votes no right thinking man will question.

But the most outrageous of all the schemes was the one to steal Jackson Ward. This banner Republican Ward with its three thousand majority was to be stolen by methods that are in keeping with the past Democratic record.

The stuffing of the ballot-box in the First Precinct, Jackson Ward, was the most criminal act in the history of the city. By it, with only about eighty white men voting, Capt. Chas. H. Epps secured 212 votes while the precinct went Democratic by 24. What have the liberal-minded Democrats to say relative to this political robbery?

Where are those who would recommend that the Negro vote the Democratic ticket?

The running of an independent Republican ticket afforded an excuse for the Democrats to spring a ticket and count out the regular nominees on the Republican ticket. The scheme miscarried and true Republicanism was triumphant.

We desire men who have a conscience—Democratic white men, to go into Jackson Ward and see how colored men, bona-fide voters, are disfranchised, and then ask themselves whether or not they are surprised at Colored men persistently voting the Republican ticket. The most unnecessary questions were asked. Men, in violation of all law, were denied the right to vote.

Possibly the most glaring outrage was that of Mr. WILLIAM GLASGOW, an old colored gentleman, who lives at Webster Street. The name has been changed to Goddin St., and although he has lived there, and voted from that place for the last twenty-five years, and his name was on the registration books as he had stated it, he was denied the right to vote.

Republicans of the North, you who are disposed to be cajoled by tales of southern Boubons; look upon the statements and draw your own conclusions. In violation to their sworn obligations, oblivious of every principle of right, they would steal from us our representation in the only Republican Ward in the city. It is the "shoe string ward." One which was made so as to embrace all of the colored people in this locality, and with a city government overwhelmingly Democratic, they would steal even that from us.

Can there be any doubt of the wisdom of passing a national election law?

Can the government afford to trust the national election machinery in the hands of such a party, who openly defies the law? We believe not.

God grant that the time will soon come that principle will be respected and a sordid greed for even non paying offices sent to the rear. It is evident that in this Christian city, many a saint in a church is a devil when an election is to be carried. It is consoling to think that a just God beholds the actions of men and knows the secret of every heart.

Quite a warm discussion took place at the Va. Baptist State Convention on the 15th inst. The occasion was that of the removal of Rev. Dr. E. K. LOVE, Rev. WM. J. SIMMONS, D. D. and Rev. WALTER H. BROOKS from the list of contributors to *The Baptist Teacher* on account of the prejudice of the whites of the South. The Colored divines were outspoken in their denunciation of the American Baptist Publication Society for what they regard as the sacrificing of their representatives in order to retain certain financial support.

Rev. Dr. E. M. BRAWLEY was on hand to represent the interest of the Society and performed that duty well.

Rev. A. BINGA, Jr., of Manchester, Va., one of the most conservative of the divines in the state caused a sensation by offering the resolutions which we published in our last issue. They were unanimously adopted.

The action of Revs. SIMMONS, BROOKS and LOVE in condemning the barbarous ousting of ministers of the gospel from first class coaches after tickets had been sold for the same will be endorsed by all right thinking people.

Their protest against the action of the American Baptist Publication Society in heeding the howl of their prejudiced element is in keeping with the self-respect and manliness which goes to show that we are just like other people.
