## ELECTION NOTICE

WHEREAS a Bill entitled "An Act to provide for a Civil Government of the Virgin Islands of the U. S. A." (Public No. 749 -S 4:24- was passed by the 74th Congress of the United States and approved June 22, 1936, provides in Section 8 thereof in part as follows: . . . "The next general election in the Virgin Islands shall be held on November 3, 1936. At such election there shall be chosen the entire membership of each Municipal Council as herein provided . . ."; and

WHEREAS the said Act, now styled the Organic Act, provides that the said Municipal Council shall be composed of nine (9) members, viz: 2 Members For Christiansted Town & Suburbs; 2 Members For Christiansied Country District; 2 Members For Frederiksted Town; 2 Members For Frederiksted Country District. And 1 Member At Large:

FOR THEREFORE, by virtue of the aforesaid Section 8 of the Organic Act, and by direction of the Governor of the Virgin Islands of the United States, a general election will be held at the Police Court House, in Christiansted, on TUESDAY, November 3, 1936, for the purpose of electing TWO MEMBERS for Christiansted, Town and Suburbs.

The balloting will commence at 9 o'clock a. m. and will close at the earliest 12M.

In conformity with Publication of Nov 15, 1906, paragraphs 1 and 2, candidates, in order to be considered at the election, must be nominated by one of the Electors of the Electoral District (or nominate themselves as candidates either by a written notice, signed by the nominator and sent to the Chairman of the Electoral Board at his official office not later than 4 o'clock p.m. FRIDAY, 30th inst., or by personal appearance of the nominator before the Electoral Board at the place where the election is to be held between 3 and 4 o'clock p. m. SATURDAY, the 31st inst.

ALL concerned will take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
