

GREAT RACE CALLED OFF

Because Crowds Got On the Auto Course

LANCIA WAS IN FIRST

Vanderbilt cup course, Long Island, Oct. 6--The automobile race for the Vanderbilt cup, which was run today, was called off at 11:25 because of the crowds that had got on the course and impeded the drivers of the cars.

How the Race Was Run. Vanderbilt Cup Course, Long Island, Oct. 6--One man was killed, a woman was mortally injured and many persons were hurt in an unprecedented rush of automobiles this morning to reach the cup course.

Wagner and George Wyman were crossing the street at Steinway and Potter avenues, when they were struck by a large touring car.

The race was postponed until a quarter past six o'clock, fifteen minutes after schedule time.

Lancia's elapsed time was four hours, 25 minutes and 28 1/2 seconds. Wagner's average speed was 61.14 miles per hour.
