## DESIRES PEACE.

# Spain Satisfied With-out More Fighting.

## Fleeing from Barcelona===Prison-ers at Portsmouth.

## Agreement with Philippines---Spain Thinks Peace Terms Must be Honorable.

### Spanish Decree.

MADRID, July 15.—The Official Gazette today publishes a royal decree temporarily suspending throughout the Spanish peninsula the rights of individuals as guaranteed by the constitution. The decree adds that the government will render an account to parliament of the use it makes of this measure.

The publication of this decree is generally accepted as convincing proof that Spain is now ready to sue for peace and that negotiations to that effect are now actually progressing.

The government wishes to have full right to suppress all and every evidence of discontent and rebellion wherever they appear, hence this imperial decree.

### Eastern Cuba.

WASHINGTON, July 15.—Major Hopkins, aide to Secretary Alger, had a huge map of Cuba spread before him last evening, looking over the surrendered territory.

### More Ships to Manila.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 15.—The transports Peru and City of Paeble left this afternoon for Manila.

### McKinley Hopes For Peace.

WASHINGTON, July 15.—In speaking of the fall of Santiago, President McKinley today said: "I hope for early peace now."

### No Peace Negotiations Yet.

WASHINGTON, July 15.—It was authoritatively stated by Secretary Vale today that up to noon no peace negotiations had been opened by anyone.

### MERRITT AT HONOLULU

American Troops Royally Welcomed by Hawaiians.

### CITY ABLAZE WITH COLORS.

Minutemen Astonish the Natives by Their Drill—Soldiers Come Through Their Long Voyage in Good Condition. Two Days of Bad Weather.

Honolulu, July 6, via San Francisco, July 15.—The monitor Monadnock, accompanied by the collier Nero, arrived here July 4. The officers and men on board the monitor were given a hearty reception by the populace.

### A Royal Welcome.

The island republic welcomed the fleet with banners flying and trumpets sounding. The steamer Maui met each transport at Diamond head and acted as escort into the harbor.

Colonel J. H. Soper, chairman of the reception committee, represented President Dole. The Hawaiian band aroused the patriotism of the troops with American and Hawaiian national airs.

### Two Days of Rough Weather.

The Ohio and Para are coaling, and the work of lightering coal into the Indiana and Morgan City will begin immediately.

Cheering multitudes, booming cannon and fearful girls were quickly forgotten once the Golden Gate of San Francisco was passed.

### More Prisoners Arrived.

PORTSMOUTH, N. H., July 15.—The Harvard arrived at six this morning having on board 1068 more Spanish prisoners.

There was considerable sickness aboard, and six died en route and one more this forenoon.

There are two Spanish surgeons here on parole, Adolfo Suarez and Gabriel Monteni Dunday.

They are kept in long, narrow one-story buildings, surrounded by barbed wire fence and stockade, guarded by marines and under the range of Gatling guns.

### San Juan Deserted.

ST. THOMAS, July 15.—Alvices received here from San Juan show that the inhabitants there are greatly alarmed.

### Dispatch from Greenleaf.

WASHINGTON, July 15.—The war department has posted the following dispatch from Adj. General Greenleaf at Siboney:—

Only twenty-three new cases of yellow fever; three deaths yesterday. The typhoid fever is very mild but they are taking vigorous precautions."

### Fleeing From Barcelona.

LONDON, July 15.—Advices from Barcelona show that the inhabitants there are panic-stricken. They think their defenseless port will be bombarded first by the Americans and many are fleeing.

### Philippines' Future.

LONDON, July 25.—S. C. Valdes, a representative of the Philippine insurgents, gives out the terms of agreement between the insurgents and Admiral Dewey.

The terms are, briefly, as follows: Independence of the Philippine islands to be proclaimed, a republic to be established with the government designated by Aguinaldo and approved by Gen. Merritt.

### May Sue For Peace.

MADRID, July 15.—Minister of war said today that peace negotiations might be arranged on terms to which both countries would agree.
