These are the chief revolutionists in Nicaragua. In the center is Estrada, the leader who wants to be president of Nicaragua.



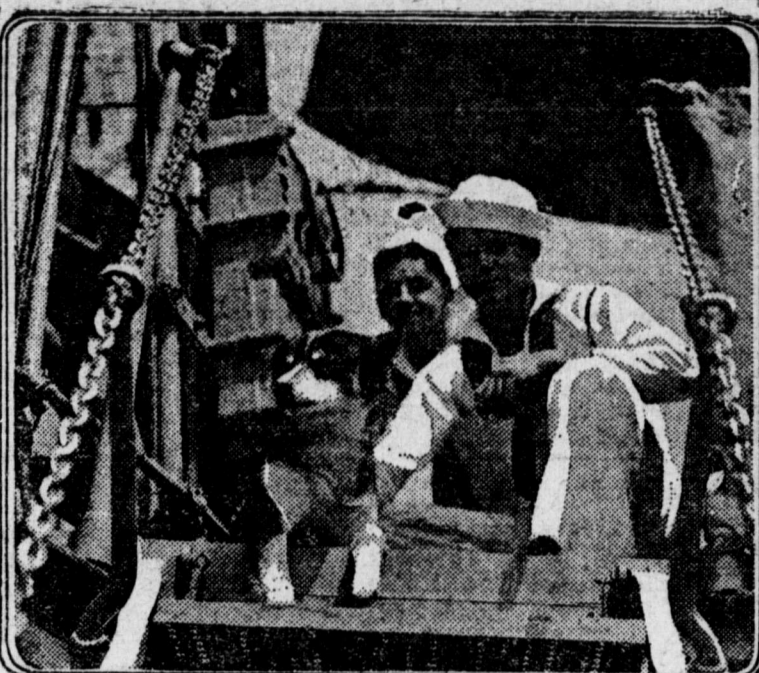
President Pedro Montt of Chile, who is also looking crossed-eyed at the United States. Montt refuses to ante up a million or so that the American syndicate claims.

The St. Andrews society of Tacoma will go to Seattle this evening to unite with the organization there in a dinner at the Arctic club.

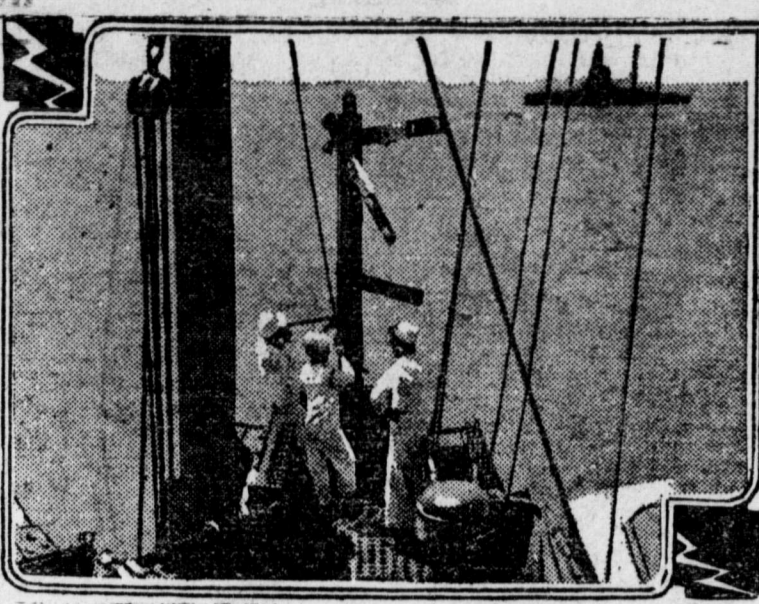
CLOSE-UP PICTURES OF UNCLE SAM'S NEW NAVY

"Doc Cook," Eskimo Dog Mascot Aboard the Battleship Minnesota.



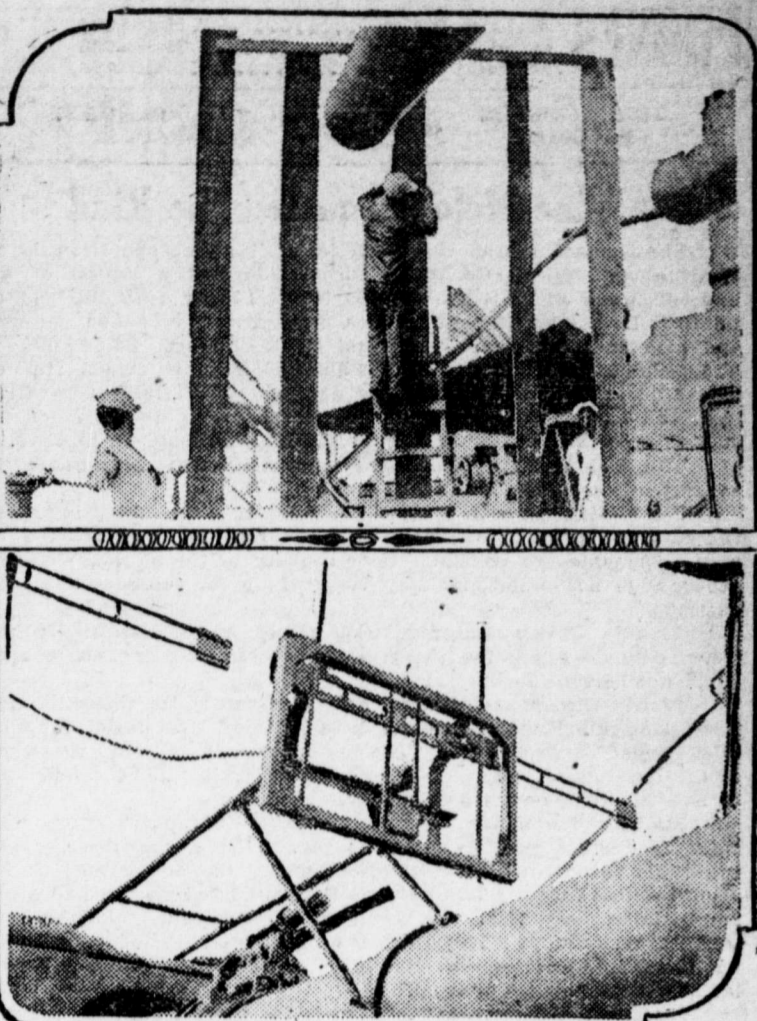
The dog you see in the picture is every inch a sailor dog. His name is "Doc Cook," and he comes from the land of the Eskimos.
