RIVER NEWS

WIRELESS WILL SOON BE TESTED ON RIVER.

Captain James G. Perkins, of the Packet Jewel, Dies—Rains Cause Another Rise.

When the Queen City of the Pittsburgh-Cincinnati packet line, returns from her New Orleans run, the wireless telegraphy will be tested for the first time on a steamboat. The Overland Wireless Company has arranged with the company to put a wireless on the big packet and to place a station at Pittsburgh and this city to test the wireless. On her next run to this city the Queen City will have her wireless working.

Captain Perkins Dead.

News was received at this port yesterday morning of the death of Captain Charles G. Perkins, age 75, of the packet Jewel. His death occurred at Evansville following a short illness from a complication of diseases. Deceased was one of the best known rivermen on the Ohio. During the Civil war he was in command of the United States sunboat Brilliant, that was in service on the Ohio and Mississippi rivers. During recent years he has been at the wheel of the Jewel that operated in the Evansville-Henderson trade.

With rains falling along the water sheds yesterday all day a slight rise

matured on the headwaters and a rise is expected here today. The marks yesterday afternoon registered but 12 feet six inches.
