WHITAKER-GLESSNER COMPANY WILL BUILD \$200,000 WAREHOUSE

CITY PERMIT GRANTED FOR THE STRUCTURE ON REYMANN BREWERY PROPERTY.

LaBelle Iron Works Gets Permit for Gas Plant—Big Addition to Presbyterian Church.

City Building Inspector J. J. Fahey yesterday granted to the Whitaker-Glessner company a permit for the erection of a \$200,000 warehouse on the property recently purchased by the Whitaker-Glessner interests from the Reymann interests. The site of the new annex is part of the Reymann brewery property, located between the Peninsula end of the Seventeenth street bridge and the Wheeling Corrugating plant.

The mammoth new warehouse will be constructed of concrete and steel and the work will be done by the

Foundation company and the Riverside Bridge company. The building will be five stories high.

LaBelle Gas Plant.
Another city permit was granted for the erection of a six-tank artificial gas plant, costing \$18,000, for the LaBelle Iron Works. The plant is to be erected on the east side of Alley G, between Thirty-first and Thirtieth streets. It was to connect this plant with the LaBelle mill that the LaBelle a little more than a week ago secured the enactment of ordinances by council permitting the crossing of Alley G with an overhead conduit, under ground tunnel and railroad switch at a grade, for which concessions the LaBelle volunteered to pave that square of Alley G.

Church Addition.
One other big permit issued this week was for the erection of a \$3,500 addition to the Second Presbyterian church. It will occupy two lots adjoining the church at Market and Twenty-first streets and will be used for the accommodation of the increasing Sunday school. The J. W. Beltz Construction company will erect this addition.

SOUTH SIDE GIRL SEVERELY BURNED

CLOTHING OF MISS IRMA GEISEL CATCHES FIRE WHILE SHE STUDIES NEAR STOVE.

Her Life Was Saved Only by the Presence of Mind of Others in the House.

Irma Geisel, the 16-year-old daughter of C. H. Geisel, the South Side baker was very seriously burned about the body and hands yesterday evening when her clothing caught fire from the flames in a gas stove. She was taken to the Ohio Valley General hospital and will recover.

Miss Geisel lives with her parents at 3207 Jacob street and is a student at Wheeling high school. According to members of the family, she had gone to her room to prepare some of her lessons and drew her chair so

close to the stove that her skirt caught fire. When she saw her clothing was ablaze she ran through the hallway and down the stairs to the first floor. During this time the fire had almost completely destroyed her wearing apparel and burned her body very severely.

The young lady was so frightened that she was unable to assist herself in anyway and it was only by the presence of mind of the other members of the family that her life was saved.

DON'T FAIL TO SEE THE MAN-EATING SHARK.

PARK VIEW MAN IS FOUND DEAD

GREEN ADAMS LIES DOWN TO SLEEP THURSDAY NIGHT IN HIS STABLE

Boy Found His Body Cold in Death in Stall Yesterday Morning—Coroner Views Body

Harry Green Adams, aged 52 years, was found dead in the stable at his home at Park View yesterday morning. Thursday evening, it is said, he drove home, unhitched his horses and put them into the stable.

A son, it is said, found him in the stable unable to climb a steep ascent to his home, and the boy got him to lie down in a stall. About ten o'clock, another boy went home and found him in the stable. He covered Mr. Adams with blankets and went on to the house and to bed.

About six o'clock yesterday morning, one of the boys, on his way to work, saw Mr. Adams still lying in the stall, apparently asleep. The boy did not disturb him but went on to his work. About ten o'clock another son found him dead.

Coroner Galia Mitchell was called shortly after the dead body was discovered, and went out to Park View and viewed the corpse. The coroner has not yet rendered any verdict.

The deceased is survived by his widow, five children, Miss Lulu, Miss Cora, Luther, Charles and Elwood, all living at home. Andrew Adams is a brother.

Funeral arrangements have not been made.

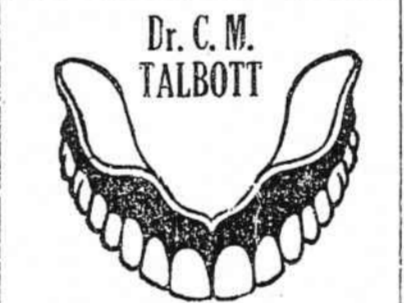
