TRAIN ARRIVES LATER

New Schedule on Pennsylvania Road Affects Arrival of Only One Train.

WATSON AGAIN ON TRIAL

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 26.—Thomas E. Watson, author, publisher and one-time populist candidate for president, will go on trial in federal district court here tomorrow for the third time on charges of sending obscene matter through the mails. The first indictment was quashed on technical grounds. Watson was reintroduced and last year the trial jury disagreed, on standing out for acquittal and two indictments were published in Watson's magazines in articles attacking the Roman Catholic church and various dignitaries of that church.

MILLIONS ARE AIDED

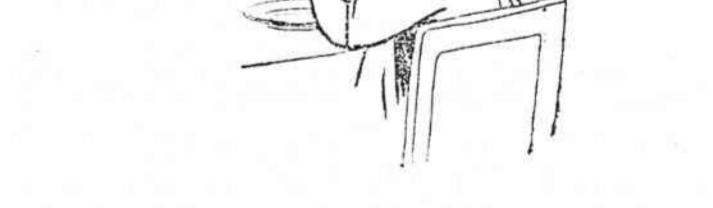
