LANDRU CLAIMS MADAME HEON ALIVE IN PARIS

Verailles, France, Nov. 18.—By the Associated Press.—Some doubt as to the guilt of the prisoner named to have been found in the hands of the jurors trying Henri Landru, called the "Butcher of Compiègne," when Landru today gave to the court an address of one of the ten women he is accused of having murdered. This woman, Madame Heon, was declared by Landru to have been alive and residing in a small hotel in Paris six months after her supposed death at his hands.

Prosecutor Godefroy told the court he had good reasons to believe that Landru's statement that Madame Heon was living at a date after the alleged murder was correct, but that an investigation would be made and a report delivered to the court tomorrow morning.

Paris, Nov. 18.—It was announced at the prefecture of police tonight that the police thus far had been unable to verify the statement of Henri Landru that Madame Heon had resided at the Hotel Du Mans. Her name was not found on the registers which hotels are bound under the law to keep, although they were minutely searched.

REDUCTION IN WAGES

On 15 and 16 cents an hour, 3 cents a minimum wage of 25 cents an hour for adult female labor is provided.

These reductions apply to plants in Chicago, St. Paul, St. Louis, Omaha, St. Joseph, Kansas City, St. Louis and Denver.

The reductions at Port Worth where wages are gauged by local labor conditions are:

Skilled labor receiving less than 42 1/2 cents an hour, 2 1/2 cents. Semi-skilled labor receiving from 42 1/2 to 47 1/2 cents an hour, 2 cents. Unskilled labor receiving more than 47 1/2 cents an hour, 1 cent.

The final test of the plan will come, however, officials say, when it is seen whether or not the bulk of employees accept the decision of their chosen representatives.

The big five plants have always been known as "open shop" industries. Packing officials say the union membership is largely confined to the smaller plants and that any strike call would not affect them seriously.

Omaha Men Accept

Chicago, Nov. 18.—The Omaha men of the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen of North America will not accept the wage reduction agreement made today in Chicago between representatives of Armour & Company and the plant committee, according to a statement made tonight by J. W. Burns, secretary of district council No. 2 of the Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen.

When informed of the reduction proposed for in the agreement in Chicago, Secretary Burns said: "The officials of the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen of North America and representatives of all the districts are in session in Chicago at this time, and we are not another proposition. I am positive that the officials are not going to accept the reduction."

Will Give Their Views. There was every indication tonight that all the powers would go into tomorrow's Far Eastern conference, fully prepared to express their views on the plan presented as a basis of discussion by China. During the two-day process the foreign delegations have been in touch with their governments, and although not all may desire to make official statements of their views at this stage of the negotiations, there is a general expectation that some progress will be possible.

The Japanese, in particular, indicated that they preferred to have their policies developed step by step as the negotiations continue. They were prepared to make various interpretations of some of the Chinese "ten points," and seemed specially interested in the proposal for the reorganization of all contracts affecting China. Should China desire to compel that Japan renounce its "spheres of influence," the step still is expected to be undertaken.

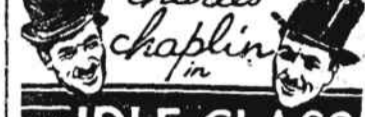
