FAIRMONT YOUTHS IN AUTO ESCAPE. Took Grafton Man's Car on a Long Joy Ride and Were Arrested.

CLARKSBURG, Oct. 16.—William Miller, of Fairmont, who, with four other youths arrested in Warsaw, Indiana, charged with stealing the seven-passenger touring car owned by Dr. E. E. Bucklew, of Grafton, was being brought to this city by Officer Jules Brasseur, made his getaway at Parkersburg yesterday.

He telegraphed the chief of police at Parkersburg at the next stop and brought the other four prisoners to Clarksburg and lodged them in the county jail. The others are Walter Willey, of Fairmont; August Miller, Park Coffee and Lawrence Bowler, of Clarksburg.

The youths, all of whom are under 21 years of age, were arrested in Warsaw suspected of having stolen the car they were driving and the local police were notified. Dr. Bucklew went to Warsaw and identified the car as his machine which was stolen on September 17. Dr. Bucklew is driving the machine back to Grafton from Indiana.
