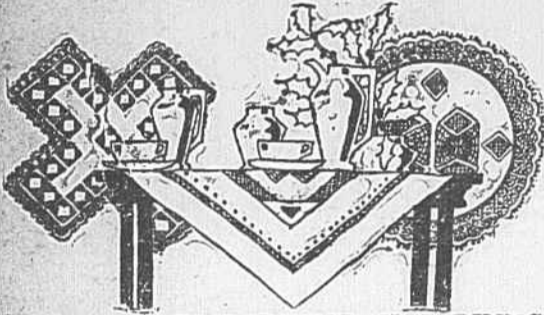

## Battleships Are Equipped Says Daniels

TOLD NAVAL COMMITTEE THAT RESERVE SHIPS ARE NOT SUPPLIED.

HIS DISCUSSION OF AFFAIRS COVERED A VARIETY OF SUBJECTS.

By Associated Press. WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—Secretary Daniels today the House naval committee that while all battleships in reserve were not supplied with shells, every dreadnaught an every other battleship in active line was equipped, but did not, however, have an adequate reserve supply.

"That," said the secretary, "is no navy secret."

Mr. Daniels, on his third day of discussion of naval affairs with the committee, covered a variety of subjects. He declared the navy was making torpedoes at Newport for \$5,000 each, more than \$1,000 less than the price at which private concerns supply them, asked that the committee authorize more than six new destroyers in view of the prices at which Saturday's bids were accepted; told that the board was making tests of a new shell promising great results from attacking submarines and urged an appropriation of \$500,000 for a government projectile plant.

"The private manufacturers charge all they can get. The question of cost does not enter into it," he said.

## Kaiser to Undergo Throat Operation

By Associated Press. GENEVA, Switzerland, Dec. 14.—A report reached Basel from Berlin this morning that Emperor William will be obliged to undergo an operation of the throat when he has sufficiently recovered from his recent illness, which is not considered serious.

The doctors, however, consider that it would be inadvisable for his majesty to return to the front for several weeks and he probably will spend Christmas at home.

Crown Prince Frederick William, the report from the capital says, has arrived in Berlin.

## Bavarian Troops Have Mutinied

By Associated Press. AMSTERDAM, via London, Dec. 14.—A dispatch from Antwerp says reports are current there of a mutiny on the part of the Bavarian troops garrisoned in the city. While the story is not confirmed it is a fact that the Bavarian barracks have been closed to outsiders.
