My Own Recipes. Tomatoes may be easily and quickly baked without the extra work of stuffing and are quite good for a chafin. Wash carefully and put in buttered muffin pans to bake.

BOILED HALIBUT. 1 thick slice halibut. Salt. Lemon juice. 1 whole small onion.

Wash fish and tie in piece of cheese cloth. Cook in boiling salted water to which 2 tablespoons lemon juice has been added 25 or 30 minutes. The onion should not be cut in slices and should be put into the water when the fish is done.

EGG SAUCE. 2 tablespoons butter. 1/2 cup water. 1/2 teaspoon salt. 1/4 teaspoon pepper. 2 eggs (well beaten).

Melt butter, stir in flour, salt and pepper and slowly add water, stirring constantly. Add yolk of egg well beaten and hard-boiled eggs cut in rather thick slices. Do not cook after adding yolk of egg.

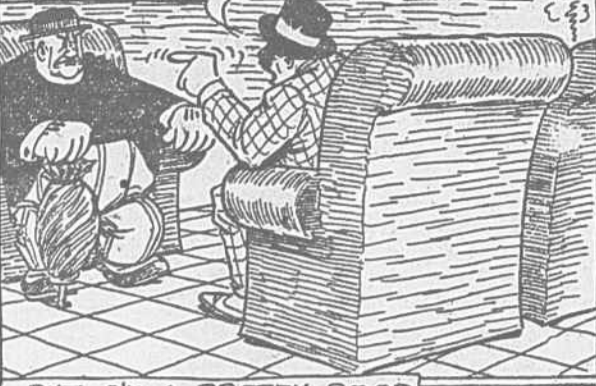

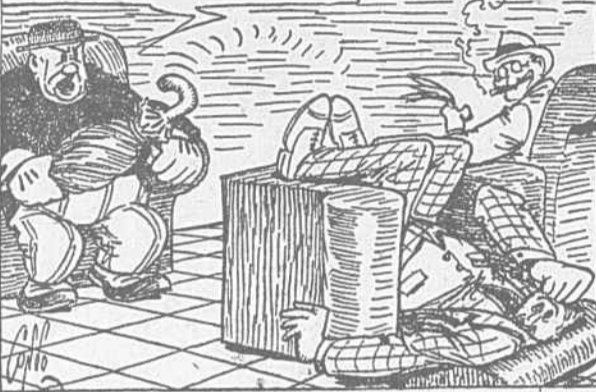
