CANAL LAWS, &c.

An act for reprinting the laws, and other official documents, relating to the Eric and Champlain Canals.

Passed February 8, 1825.

1. Be it enacted by the people of the State of New-York, Duty of Secrerepresented in Senate and Assembly, That the Secretary of State tary of State. be, and he is hereby, authorized to collect and cause to be printed, all the law hitherto passed, or which may be passed at the present session of the Legislature, in relation to the Erie and Champlain Canals; together with the Annual Reports of the Canal Commissioners; and such other documents, as the Joint Committee on Canals, may deem requisite, for a complete official history of those works.

II. And be it further enacted. That it shall be lawful for the Joint Committee on Canals, on being furnished by the Canal Maps to be Commissioners with correct maps, delineating the routes of the Erie and Champlain canals, and designating the lands through which they pass, whether belonging to, or conveyed by, individuals to the state, or for which damages have been or are to be appraised, to direct the Secretary of State to procure the same to be engraved.

III. And be it further enacted, That the Treasurer of this Provision to state pay, on the warrant of the Comptroller, such sum or sums pay expenses. of money, as the said Comptroller may deem reasonable and proper, for defraying the expense of preparing, printing and engraving the laws, reports, documents and maps aforesaid.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the number of copies of Number of the laws, reports, documents and maps, authorized to be printed copies, and how to be and engraved as aforesaid, shall not exceed one thousand; six disposed of. copies thereof shall be furnished to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of this state; one copy thereof to the clerk of each county in this state, for the use of such county; and after reserving a sufficient number of copies for the use of the Senate and Assembly, and for the state Library, that the residue shall be placed at the disposal of the Commissioners of the Canal Fund, to be distributed in such manner as they may deem proper.

V. And be it further enacted, That the Secretary of State Copy right to shall cause the copy right of the said laws, reports, documents be secured, &c. and maps, to be secured according to law, and that it shall be lawful for him to make such arrangement with the publishers in




