The 6th and 19th Districts are contested.

The 2d, 3d, 4th and 5th Districts (Kings County) gave 9,311 Democratic majority in 1880.

These statistics prove, beyond question:—

That from President Arthur's own State a decided majority of the delegates to the National Convention are opposed to his nomination.

That the overwhelming preponderance of delegates from districts giving Republican majorities, is for Blaine .

That twelve (12) Republican districts and four (4) Democratic districts send delegates for Blaine ; that five (5) other districts send Edmunds or anti- Arthur delegates; while but five (5) Republican districts send delegates for Arthur , the large majority of his support coming from ten (10) Democratic districts.

That in the Blaine districts there is an aggregate of **63,773** Republican majorities, against **17,456** Republican majorities in Arthur districts; with **5,156** Democratic majorities in Blaine districts, and **45,940** Democratic majorities in Arthur districts.

These facts and figures are conclusive, that in New York, as in other States where Electoral Votes may be given to a Republican candidate for President, the direct Republican expression is in favor of James G. Blaine's nomination; indeed, that he is the accepted leader of the Republican party, to a sure victory!

In full confidence that with James G. Blaine as the Republican Standard-bearer, the State of New York will give him its Electoral vote, the undersigned delegates, from that State, commend
