To the Selectmen of the Town of Greeting.

YOU are hereby required, in the name of the State of New-Hampshire, to notify and warn a meeting of the Inhabitants of the said town of qualified to vote in the choice of Senators for the State Legislature, to be held on the last Monday of August next, to vote by ballot for five persons, duly qualified for Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, agreeably to an act passed June 21, A. D. 1792. And in the warning and notification of said meeting, you are to give fifteen days notice of the time and place for holding said meeting.—You are also to sign the copy of the record of said meeting, with the town clerk: and certificates, thus attested, of all votes taken at said meeting, are to be sealed up, and directed to the Secretary of the State, with a superscription expressing the purport thereof, and transmitted to the Sheriff of the county, in which such meeting was holden, within ten days after the time of holding such meeting, or to the Secretary's Office in Concord, within twenty days at farthest from and after the time of holding said meeting.
