Bismuth would also be a great acquisition, and profitable to the owner of the mine. As it is highly probable that articles, which abound in so many parts of Europe, are not totally wanting in this extensive country, we earnestly request you to make the necessary inquiries in your neighbourhood, and, should you discover any thing which promises a favourable result, to transmit an account of it to us.
