# NEW AMENDMENT AFFECTS JAPAN-EDUCATED EVACUEES

The provision in section 60.4-3B of the "Handbook on Leave" that provides the project directors the right to grant indefinite leaves in advance of leave clearances to male U.S. citizens has been amended.

#### LUMBER, ROPE FOR TULE BOUND

Lumber, rope, twine and paper boxes will be furnished for repatriating families who are going to Tule Lake within ten days of their departure, stated Tom Makino, head of the Public Works division.

Block managers are now in the midst of a survey for requirements, and after a tabulation is made, will issue as much material as possible within a reasonable amount as families are to do individual crating. Freight items are to be crated and not solidly boxed.

### RESIDENTS MUST REGISTER TO GET INTERVIEWS, JOBS

Requisitions for workers in all departments and sections must be filed in open form, not specifying any particular worker or workers to be assigned. Workers may not be place at work until appropriate assignment documents have been issued. Unemployed persons must contact the Employment division for placement.

All unemployed persons seeking employment must go to the Employment division for interviews. On the basis of these interviews, their employment cands will be brought up to date and such persons will be contacted by the Placement section menopositions for thich they are suited are available.

The directors are no longer authorized to grant indefinite leaves to citizens who have returned to the United States since 1935 and who have lived ten years of more in Japan after the age of six, or have received all, or most of their formal education in Japan, or who have had formal education in Japan after the age of fifteen.

Persons falling into one or more of these categories will be granted indefinite or seasonal leaves only after leave clearance hearings have been held for them. This would mean that a short delay would be necessary for these citizens to obtain clearance approvals.

#### OWNERS MUST MUZZLE PETS
